It's a great pleasure to announce that the Organizing Committee of the WFDYS Camp of the country South Korea will support the 8th World Federation for the Deaf Youth Section's Camp Organizing Committee (WFDYS COC). **This Worldwide camp will be held in Jeju, South Korea from July 2nd to 8th 2023.**

"Yesterday, Today, Tomorrow" is the theme for the 8th WFDYS Youth Camp in July, 2023. This theme will highlight **the importance of Changes for a better world of Deaf.**

For the first time in Asia, the camp will host in Jeju Island, Korea, along with the WFDYS. Deaf Youths will discuss the diversity of the past, modern and future through this theme. By developing the Deaf community from the past to the present through the lives of Deaf, we are trying to see a world where we are united and dependent on each other until the future. In other words, if we live in the present and start learning the past, Deaf youths will be positive and open-minded, meaning that we will not make mistakes in the future. We are looking forward to encourage Deaf youths who should recognize the importance of Deaf history, and what is important to live the present and move forward to a better future.

Vision

1. Developing a strong understand of culture, diversity, environment and Identity through exchanges with Deaf youths around the world

8th WFDYS Youth Camp Logo



The logo represents flower, circle, leave, ocean in the sense of diversity, equality, ally, and freedom. Hallasan mountain in the middle of the island is intended to give you an opportunity to experience beautiful and proud Korean culture on Jeju Island, a world-renowned attraction certified by UNESCO. The symbol of Jeju appears in a human shape from a stone called Dolharubang. Dolharubang means a grandfather made of stone, and it is protected in Jeju Island with the belief that it protects well-being and public order.

Leave is like diversity, Flower is like equality, Circularity is like ally, and the Blue Sea is like freedom. During this camp, Dolharubang protects us and expresses it in Turkish blue color to unite Deaf youths by becoming one. Hallasan mountain, which is magnificent and huge created by nature as highest mountain in South Korea.

As high as it is, the mountain expresses the wishes and wishes of all Deaf youths who want each field to be as high as Hallasan mountain, not as low as the bottom.

Just as Hallasan mountain, which has risen even higher through all the past, present, and future processes, eventually become one of the beautiful nature. It symbolizes the hope for Deaf youths will do the same. If you look at the overall atmosphere here, you can feel nature. However, **the theme of 'Yesterday, Today, Tomorrow' can also be seen as nature.** Because of this, something is created by nature as time passes, we also grow in Deaf human rights, sign language, culture, etc. In that way, Deaf youths naturally take a step forward and aim for growth as the foundation blooms.

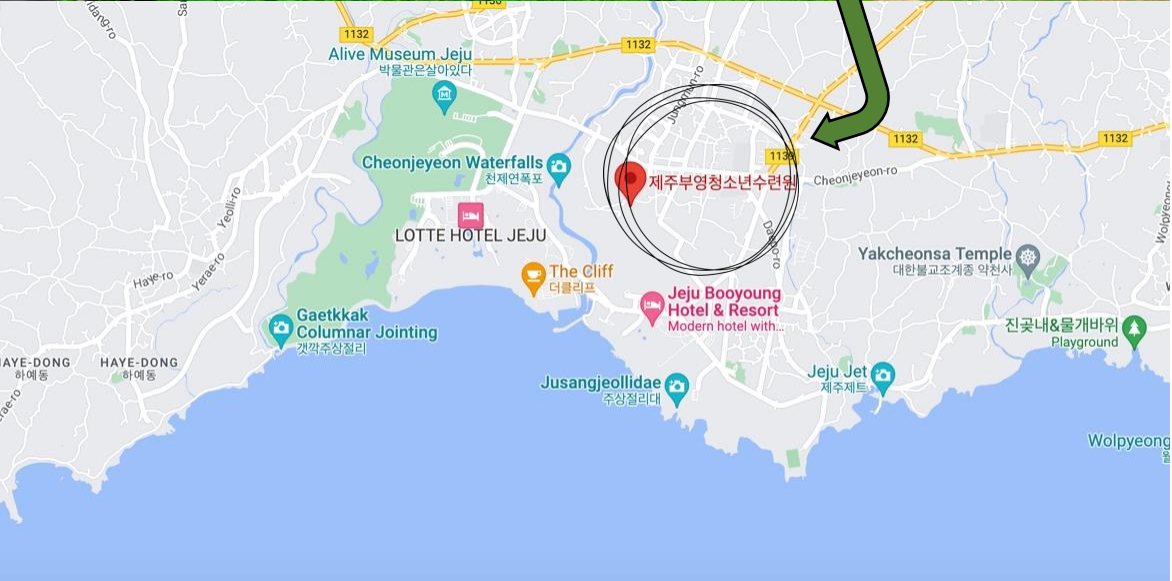

Jeju Island Visa-Free Entry Information

● Temporary suspension measures have been applied to 90 countries/regions* that have a visa-waiver or visa-free entry program with the Republic of Korea, as of April 13, 2020.

※ 56 Visa-waiver countries and 34 Visa-free countries/regions

(※ Entry restrictions have been implemented for Japan as of March 9, 2020)

● Accordingly, persons with a passport from the relevant 90 countries/regions, which are subject to the suspension measure as listed below, are required to obtain a visa from a Korean diplomatic mission to enter the Republic of Korea.
